

# Packing List

## Essential items

- Sleeping bag or bedding
- Pillow
- Personal toiletries & Deodorant
- Tooth Brush & Tooth Paste
- 1-2 Towels
- Reusable Water bottle
- Alarm clock or Phone
- Phone Charger
- Flashlight
- Sunblock
- Insect repellent
- 1 Pair - Sturdy Close-toed Shoes
- 1 Pair - Flip-flops or Shower Shoes
- 3-4 Pairs Long pants/Shorts
- 6-7 Weather Appropriate Shirts
- 1-2 Sweatshirts or Jackets
- Sunglasses
- Hat or Sun visor

Do not bring any firearms,  
ammunition or arrows!

## We also suggest

- Rain gear
- 1 Pair - Extra shoes (old ones are best)
- Ear plugs
- Camera, batteries/chargers, cables, etc.
- Backpack or Drawstring Bag
- Snacks - Beef Jerky or Granola Bars
- Spending Money
- Your willingness to try new things!!**

- When it comes to Clothing, bring items that withstand trips to the field. You will be hiking near streams in the forest, walking through tall grass, etc. Good, practical, rugged clothing should be the rule. A good raincoat and pants or poncho with waterproof hat and shoes are a necessity. Be prepared for rain. It can be muddy!
- Beds and mattresses are furnished but you will need to bring your own sheet, blankets, and a pillow if you want one. Good sleeping bags will also fit the bill and are recommended, but remember, the nights can get down to freezing and below. So, come prepared!
- The amount of Spending Money that you bring is ultimately a family decision. Please note, there will be opportunities to stop at gift shops or purchase snacks or ice cream at or between various activities during the week. \$10-\$15 per day is recommended.
- A notebook and writing equipment may be needed to take notes in the field on what you see and do. You may be asked to appear at clubs and report on the week's happenings. All of this requires notes. You may also want to write home during your stay at camp.
- Cell phones will work at camp, but reception is limited. iPads, tablets, gaming devices, laptops, etc. are not recommended but if you choose to bring one, it will be your duty to keep them safe. If your property is lost, damaged or stolen, the camp will not be held responsible.
- Fishing is available at camp. We supply basic tackle. If you want to bring, your own equipment, that is fine. Spin fishing equipment is the best, fly rod equipment next. Heavy casting equipment, bass lures etc., are not practical.
